

Parent Tip – Week 4



Purpose:

We want to teach our child(ren) to Ask Permission. When children Ask Permission, they avoid doing something that could be a problem and, they increase the chance Permission will be given.

Tip:

Tell your child what behaviors you want them to do and why. Then practice the skill.

Setting Expectations promotes your child's success and holds them accountable for their own behavior. It establishes your expectations for their behavior and provides an opportunity to PRAISE them for practicing social skills. In addition, it helps the parent/child relationship. Set your expectations when you are teaching the skill and when you need to review the skill for use in a new situation.
